Disabilities, which by any of the Laws and Statutes of Great-Britain are or may be inflicted upon such Persons convicted of wilful Perjury. But if any of the faid Prifoners shall upon their Arraignment for any of the faid Crimes, stand mute, or not answer directly, or shall perfuffer as Felons emptorily challenge above the Number of Twenty Persons returned to serve of the Jury; he or they so offending shall fuffer as a Felon Convict, and shall lose the Benefit of the Clergy and of this Act, in the same Manner as he or they should have done if they had been indicted, arraigned, and found guilty, if it appear to the Justices, before whom fuch Felons be arraigned, by Evidence given before them or by Examination, that the same Felonies, whereon they are so arraigned, had been such Felonies by reason whereof they should have lost the Benefit of their Clergy. And when any Person or Persons shall be so, as aforesaid, convicted or attainted of any of the faid Crimes, they shall fuffer as the Laws of Great-Britain now do or hereaster Justices to give shall direct and require in such Cases respectively. shall and may be lawful for the Justices of the Court, where any of the faid Attainders or Convictions shall happen, to give and pronounce fuch Judgment or Sentence against the Persons so attainted or convicted, as their Crimes respectively require, according to the Manner, Form and Direction of the Laws of that Part of Great-Britain called England, in the like Cases; and thereupon to award and order Execution to be done accordingly.

AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED by the Authority aforesaid, That if any Woman shall be Womenconcealdelivered of any Issue of her Body, Male or Female, which ing the Denth of their Baffards being born alive, should by the Law be deemed a Bastard, to be deemed and that the endeavours privately, either by Drowning, or Murdeness. fecret Burying thereof, or any other Way, by herfelf or the procuring of others, so to conceal the Death thereof as it may not come to Light, whether it were born alive or not, but be concealed; in every such Case the Mother so offending, being convicted thereof according to the usual Course of Proceeding in Capital Crimes within this Government, shall suffer Death, as in Case of Murder, except such Mother can make Proof by one Witness at the least, that the Child, whose Death was by her so intended to be conceal'd, was born dead. And if any Person or Persons shall Accessaries to counsel, advise or direct such Woman to kill the Child such Murder: fhe goes with, and, after she is delivered of such Child. she kills it; every fuch Person so advising or directing, shall be deemed Accessary to such Murder, and shall have the fame Punishment as the Principal shall have.

AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED by the Authority aforefaid, That the Statute against Stab- The Statute abing, made in the First Year of the Reign of King JAMES gainst Stabbing the First, Chapter the Eighth, entituled, An All to take away the Benefit of the Clergy for some kind of Manslaughter; shall be duly observed and put in Execution in this Government, and be of like Force and Effect as if the fame Act were here repeated and enacted: But that all fuch Perfons as shall happen to be present and aiding to the flabbing another, which by the faid Act is made Murder, shall not be deemed Principals, but Accessaries to such Stabbing.

AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED by the Authority aforesaid, That if any Person or Persons concison Purpose, and of Malice fore-thought, and by lying in ted of cutting Wait, shall unlawfully cut out, or disable the Tongue, put est or disabling out an Eye, flit the Nose, cut off the Nose or Lip, or cut fallinffer as off or difable any Limbs or Members of any of the King's Felow. Subjects, with Intention in fo doing to main or disfigure in any of the Manners before mentioned, fuch his Majesty's

faid Courts, and they are hereby required, in fuch Cafes, to cause an Order of Court to be made, thereby commanding and authorifing the present Sheriff or Coroner, upon, payment of the Confideration Money for which fuch Lands and Tenements were fold by the former Officer, to execute fuch lawful Deed or Deeds, and to do all other lawful Acts for the conveying or delivering over the faid Lands and Tenements to the Purchaser or Creditor, as the Officer who fold the same could or ought to have done by Virtue of the faid Writ or Writs, or by any Law of this Government; and fuch Sale or Sales, to made by Virtue of any fuch Order of Court, shall be available in Law, and the respective Vendees, Mortgagees or Creditors, their Heirs and Affigns, shall hold and enjoy the same, freed and discharged as asoresaid.

## An ACT against Adultery and Fornication.

OR the Preservation of Virtue and Chastity among the People of this Government, and to prevent the heinous Sins of Adultery and Fornication, BE ENACTED by the Honourable PA-GORDON, Efg; Lieutenant Governor of the Counties of New-Cafile, Kent and Suffex upon Delaware, and Province of Pennfyloania, by and with the Advice and Confent of the Representatives of the Freemen of the faid Counties in General Affembly met, and by the Authority of the same; That whosever shall commit Adultery, and be thereof legally convicted, shall forfeit and pay the Sum of Fifty Pounds, one Moiety thereof to the Use of Penalty and the Governor for the Support of Government, and the Adultery. other Moiety to the Use of the Poor of the County where the same is committed, or otherwise to be publickly whipt with Iwenty-one Lashes on his or her Back, well laid on at the common Whiping-Post, at the Election of the Party convicted. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED Penalty on Per- by the Authority aforefaid, That if any Person or Persons font appointed to who shall be appointed by the respective County-Courts view, &c. reg- aforesaid to view and make Return of such Road or Roads as shall be proper and convenient as aforesaid, shall neglect or refuse to perform and execute such Charge and Duty, (unless prevented and hindered by unavoidable Accidents) fuch Person or Persons so neglecting or resuling, being thereof convicted by his or their own Confession, or by the Oath or Affirmation of One Witnels before any Magistrate of the respective County where such Order for viewing any Road or Roads shall be made as aforesaid, shall forseit and pay to the Overfeer or Overfeers of the Hundred wherein fuch Road shall be petitioned for, the Sum of Ten Shillings for every such Default; and in case of Non-Payment thereof, the same shall be levied of the Goods and Chattels of fuch Defaulter or Defaulters, by Diffreis and Sale thereof, by virtue of a Warrant from any Justice of the Peace of the respective County as asoresaid; and such Fine or Fines shall be applied towards defraying and paying the Charge of the laying out such Road or Roads as aforesaid.
